Ishibutai Tumulus

This tumulus was created in the early 7th century and has a horizontal stone chamber of the largest size in Japan. The total weight of the 30 large and small stones is approx. 2,300 tons. You can even enter the tumulus and watch it from inside!

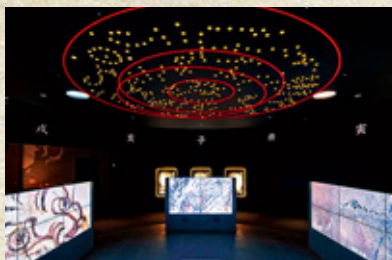

Sakafuneishi (Sake Trough Stone)

A mysterious stone structure surrounded by a bamboo grove. There is a theory that the carved dents and grooves were used in the production of sake. Sakafuneishi appears in the famous comic *The Three-Eyed One* by Osamu Tezuka.

An imperial palace site from the seventh century where visitors can view a part of the restored architectural remains. The Isshi Incident, believed to be the first coup d'état in Japan, occurred in this place.

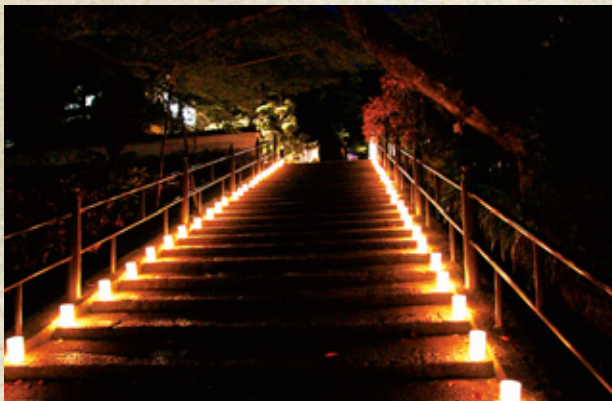


Autumn events

Autumn is the season of festivals. The lighting event Asuka-Hikari-no-Kairo is worth a visit, where the ancient capital is wrapped in candlelight to the sounds of heroic Japanese drums.

Asuka-Hikari-no-Kairo

The attractions in Asuka include nostalgic pastoral views of red spider lilies and scarecrows along footpaths between rice fields and haystacks in rice fields. You can see Japanese-style life from the romantic ancient days whenever you visit Asuka in spring, summer, autumn, or winter.

The gorgeous cherry blossoms that bloom around the Ishibutai Tumulus are a must see. The blossoms are illuminated at night and create a fantastic mood.

Driving away evil spirits

Onda Matsuri Festival

This festival is held in the Asukaniimasu-jinja Shrine on the first Sunday of February. The day of the festival starts with an event that drives away evil spirits. This rare festival is famous for the play where masked actors pretend to be a married couple having sex and praying for the prosperity of descendants.

Kaisanki Nodate

An open-air tea ceremony is held at the Oka-dera Temple on the anniversary of the temple foundation in October. The first 1,000 visitors are served matcha tea for free.

Furusato Summer Festival

Fantastic fireworks are set off in the Historical Park. Foods from stands in the night market are all delicious! This summer festival is held on August 15.



Kugatachi in the Amakashiniimasu-jinja Shrine

This ritual event is held on the first Sunday of April to commemorate the ancient trials where suspects were judged by putting their hands into boiling water. It was believed that innocent people would not burn, and liars would be scalded.

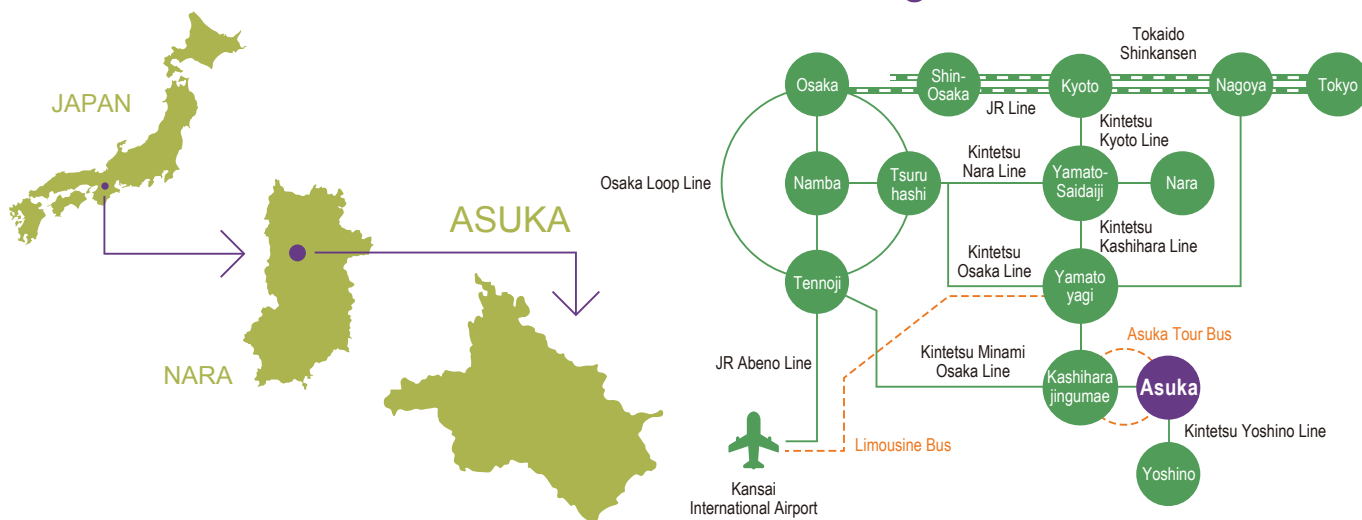
